Background

- Increase of CB attacks as well as attack preparation (linked to radicalization)
- SSH research approaches to CBRNe topic are scarce (past focus mainly on technological tools and procedures)
- Need to focus on the citizen (diverse and vulnerable groups) during the preparedness and response phases
- EU action plan on CBRN preparedness
- More and more interest from the railway side (e.g. UIC survey)

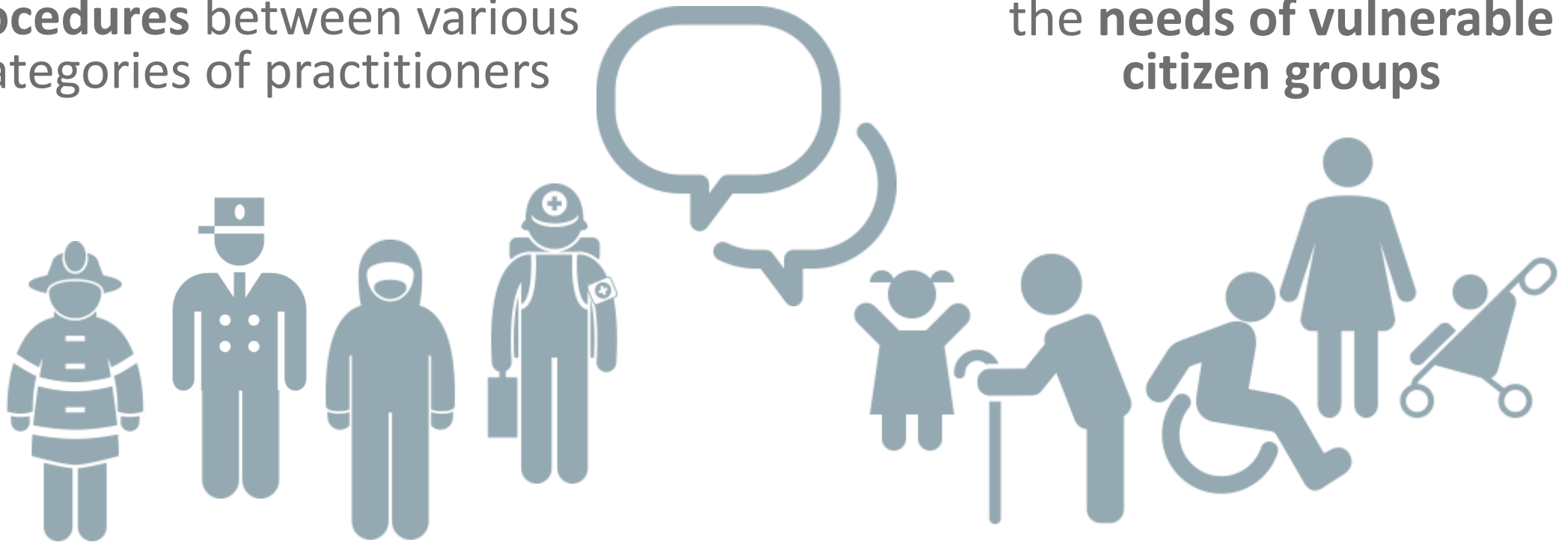


Objectives

and a better articulation with the **needs of vulnerable citizen groups**

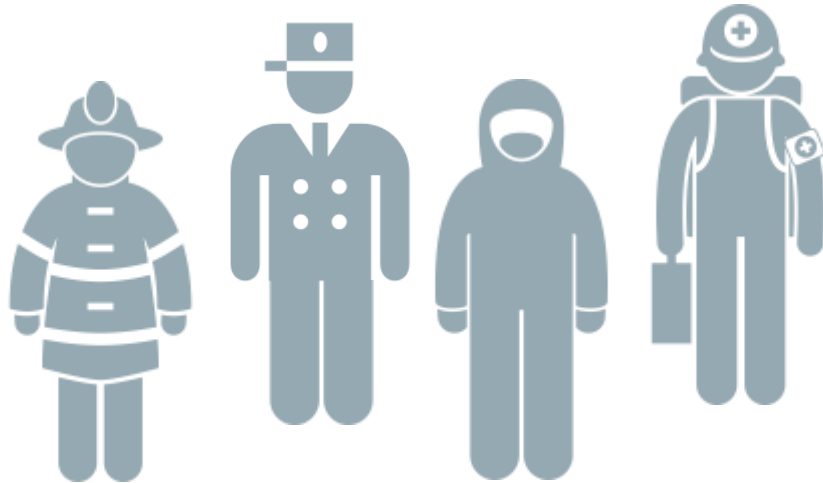

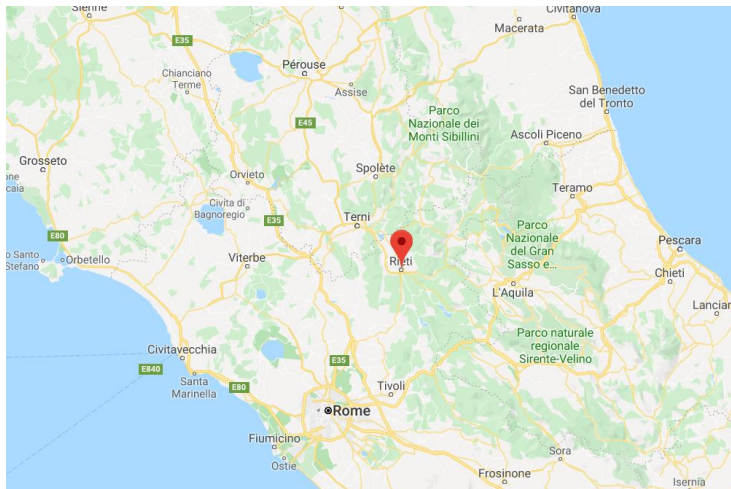
Multidisciplinary field exercises

Members of vulnerable groups will participate as role-play volunteers in the exercises

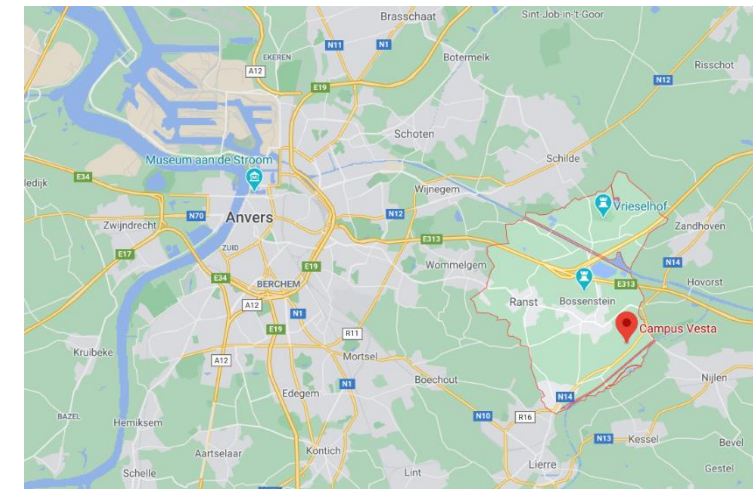
